# Underneath the Layers

A feminist, choral debut novel about identity, motherhood, transracial adoption and domestic violence, *Underneath the Layers* is the story of a racialized, lesbian woman's search for herself.

From the streets of Ho Chi Minh City to Mont Saint-Clair in Sète, from a village in the Vosges to the clamor of Bangkok, Linh, adopted in Vietnam by French parents, reconstructs her own story through the voices of her two mothers, Françoise and Minh, and her own.

How to build yourself when you are a Vietnamese child in a white family? How do you find yourself when you belong to nothing? Can fragmented memories form a coherent whole? In *Underneath the Layers*, three stories intertwine and three voices come together to say one thing: today, Linh is exactly where she wants to be.




Dominique Fouchard is a historian, who specializes in the return of soldiers. After a historical essay, *The Fair for Fiancés* is her first novel.
